WHERE WE WORK

Ya'axché operates within an area known as the Maya Golden Landscape (MGL) in southern Belize. It is centered around the Golden Stream watershed and the Golden Stream Corridor Preserve (GSCP). The 15,441 acre GSCP, the 100,000 acre Bladen Nature Reserve and the 36,000 acre Maya Mountain North Forest Reserve, located in the north of MGL are managed by Ya'axché.

The MGL forms the primary southern biological corridor for Belize, which is the only remaining broadleaf forest link between the Maya Mountains and the forested coastal plains of southern Belize.


